

MSU COVID-19 VACCINATION & QUARANTINE INFORMATION

2021-2022

Morehead State University encourages everyone to get a Covid vaccination. This is great way to protect yourself and your campus community. If you're not sure if the vaccine is right for you, please consult with your medical provider.

Covid-19 vaccinations (including the booster shot) are widely available. Locally, you can receive a Covid vaccine through St. Claire Healthcare, the Gateway Health Department, and most local pharmacies. Go to <http://vaccinefinder.org> to find out where vaccines are available.

Important Information, Please Read:

In most cases, Morehead State University will not accommodate on-campus quarantine. Students who must quarantine due to close contact exposure to Covid-19 will be expected to quarantine at home/off-campus at their own expense.

- If you are a close contact exposure to Covid-19 and you are not fully vaccinated, then you must quarantine off-campus.
- If you are fully vaccinated and booster-eligible, but you have not received the booster shot, then you must quarantine off-campus.

Ensure you have travel and quarantine plans in place in the event that you must quarantine due to close contact exposure to Covid-19.

The best way to avoid quarantine is to be fully vaccinated and boosted for Covid-19.

* There are three (3) vaccines authorized for use in the US: The Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna vaccines both require two doses while the Johnson & Johnson vaccine uses a single dose. Individuals are considered to be fully vaccinated two weeks after their final dose.
