PURPOSE:

To establish the guidelines and procedure for repeating courses.

SCOPE:

All graduate and undergraduate students.

DESCRIPTION (INCLUDE DEFINITIONS):

Undergraduate students are permitted to repeat any course for which they have earned a grade of "B" or lower. They may repeat the course no more than two times. The last grade earned is the official grade for the course, even if it is lower than the previous grade. Failure a third time will result in the student not being allowed to re-enroll for that course. Students may appeal to the Office of Undergraduate Education and Student Success.

Graduate students are permitted to repeat any course regardless of the grade received. Only the grade received on the last attempt is computed in the cumulative GPA. The credit hours will be counted only once toward meeting the program requirements. The policy was effective 8/1/2010 and is not retroactive.

Once the degree/certificate has been conferred, the academic degree is locked. Courses are not eligible to be repeated and have a previous grade replaced once the degree has been conferred.


