The Spring 2023 semester was a busy one! The nursing team has

taken an "All Hands on Deck" approach for nursing student recruitment in all programs. The American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) published a brief sharing declining enrollment in baccalaureate and registered nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) na-

The AACN also reported decreased enrollment in graduate-level programs including Ph.D. programs in nursing. The Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program showed a slight increase in enrollments for academic year 2021-2022.

Elizabeth received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Morehead State University in Public History. She came to us from BoomTown as a Senior Calling Concierge.




As the ADS, her major responsibilities include the day-to-day management of the Department of Nursing. This includes all aspects of budget management, scheduling of classrooms and

reetings from the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing (AASN) Program! We are excited to announce receiving approval to change the AASN Program admission criteria allowing students the option of providing documentation

of an ACT score of 20 or higher or an ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) exam score of 80% or higher for admission to the program. This will allow students more flexibility in meeting admission requirements. This will become effective for the students applying to the AASN Program in the fall for the Spring 2024 cohort. Both the ACT and TEAS exam may be scheduled at the MSU Testing Center. We currently admit 40 students at the Morehead campus and 20

at the Mt. Sterling campus each semester. Admission applications are still being accepted for Fall 2023.

The AASN Program currently has an enrollment of 130 students. Twentyone students received the Associate of Applied Science degree at Morehead State University's commencement ceremony on December 10th.

Several of the graduates were recognized for their achievements during the AASN Graduate Reception held on December 6th. Among those receiving awards was Drew Warnecke for Excellence in Service. The BSN program will be implementing an additional option for students to gain entry into the prelicensure BSN program by adding the TEAS exam. Students will now have the option to submit either the American College Test (ACT) score with a mandatory minimum composite score of 20 or higher; or the ATI Test for Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) Examination with a mandatory minimum total score of 80% or higher. This admission change was approved through the curricular process in May 2023. This will go into effect for students seeking admission into the January 2024 cohort. MSU Testing Center will be offering the ACT and the TEAS for students who need to schedule either exam. Interested applicants may contact the Testing Center to schedule at 606-783-2526.

he Master of Science in Nursing (MSN), Family Nurse Practitioner (FNPP), with a primary care focus, graduated a cohort of three students in December 2022 and anticipate an additional six students will graduate May 2023. These students completed 600 practicum hours and course work to enable them to sit for certification exams. The certification exam pass rate for

those testing in 2022 was 83.33%. There are currently sixteen active students enrolled in the MSN Program. The MSN maintains accreditation by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

The MSN Program will undergo a site visit for continuing CCNE program accreditation on October 23-25, 2023. The onsite evaluation will take place on the campus of Morehead State University located at 151 University Blvd, Morehead KY 40351; phone #: 606-783-2296.

The public is invited to submit written third-party comments that must be received by CCNE 21 days (by October 2, 2023) before the scheduled on-site evaluation. Contact information for CCNE is listed on the right.

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There are currently thirty-seven students enrolled in the Post-Licensure Baccalaureate Nursing Program. We had ten December 2022 graduates and anticipate an additional three graduates in May 2023. We are very proud of our graduates and look forward to seeing the positive contributions they make to the health care environment.

The early enrollment option for students matriculating from the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing (AASN) Program to the Post-Licensure Baccalaureate Nursing Program has been very successful. Qualifying students can now complete nine hours of required Post-Licensure Program nursing courses prior to graduating from the AASN Program. AASN students have shown interest in the initiative and are demonstrating success in the Post-Licensure Baccalaureate nursing courses. Due to the demonstrated student success, a third class (NURB 314: Health Assessment in Nursing) will be added as an early enrollment option this fall.

The RN-MSN track continues accepting applicants. Qualified students in the Post-licensure Baccalaureate Nursing Program can earn up to nine hours of dual credit toward the Bachelors Degree in Nursing and the Master of Science in Nursing Program. This track saves students time and money when completing both degrees.
